SETTING THE SCENE

- The Dragons' 50th season of girls basketball heads to the postseason with a familiar foe. This is the 68th meeting between the county rivals and the 10th sectional meeting. G-C is the lone opponent that has been on the schedule for each of the 50 years of Dragons varsity basketball. NP leads the all-time series 34-33 and has won nine of the last 11 meetings.
- The two teams met Dec. 8, a game the Dragons dropped 60-52 in overtime. Allie Blum scored 19 points and Kenna Tweedy 12 to lead the Dragons.
- The Dragons have won six sectional titles in their history in 1990, 1992, 1993, 2004, 2018 and 2020.
- The only other time NP has played in a sectional at Pendleton Heights was in 2004. The Dragons won the title, beating New Castle 75-54 and Pendleton Heights 39-35.
- NP is 39-42 overall in sectional games and 22-21 in the class era (post-1998). In Class 4A (since 2012), the Dragons are 15-10 in sectional games and 15-12 in tourney games.
- The winner of this game faces either Pendleton Heights or Muncie Central at 7:30 p.m. Friday.

DRAGONS NOTES

- The Dragons clinched their ninth overall conference championship and third Hoosier Heritage Conference title this season, going 6-1 in conference play. They clinched it with two victories in January, beating Pendleton Heights 52-48 Jan. 12 and clinching it with a 47-35 victory over Yorktown in the Jan. 25 regular season finale.
- The Dragons clinched a winning record for the ninth straight season setting a program record. The streak began in 2015 and has lasted through three head coaches. Previously, the Dragons posted eight straight winning seasons from 1991-99 under the direction of Allen Cooper.
- Against Yorktown, the Dragons shot a season-best 51.5% from the field (17-33) and used a big start. NP jumped out to an 18-6 lead after a quarter and extended it as high as 33-12 midway through the third, cruising to the victory.
- With a title on the line, the Dragons' senior starters delivered. Allie Blum had a strong all-around game with 16 points on 6-10 shooting, eight rebounds, five assists and three steals. Vivian Miller added 12 points on 4-8 shooting, six rebounds and three steals. Sadey Hughbanks added seven points and Kylee Beranek six as the Dragons played a strong defensive game.
- On the Jan. 23 Senior Night against Greensburg, the Dragons jumped out to an 18-8 lead against a Top 5 team, then rallied in the fourth quarter to tie the game at 35 before the Pirates scored the game's last 10 points. Miller scored 12 points to lead the Dragons, while Blum added 11 points, six boards and three steals.
- Blum reached 200 career steals against Yorktown. She needs 12 points to reach 700 for her career.
- Miller hit the 500-point mark against Yorktown and has 504 for her career. She needs four rebounds for 200 and two assists for 150 for her career.
- Blum ranks third in the HHC in scoring (17.4 ppg), with Miller 10th (11.6 ppg).
- Miller is the HHC's leader in assists (3.3 apg), with Blum fifth (2.5 apg). Blum ranks fourth in the league in steals (3.7 spg).
- Among players with at least 10 made 3-pointers this season, **Kenna Tweedy** ranks second in 3-point percentage at 40%.

SCOUTING THE COUGARS

- With 17 wins, G-C is experiencing its best season since going 17-11 in 2016-17. It's their most regular season victories since going 23-5 in 2015-16, their last sectional championship season.
- Junior Madison Sonsini leads G-C at 14.2 ppg and 8.8 rpg, while junior Chaney Brown adds 13.7 ppg and 2.4 apg. Junior Brooklyn McConnell tallies 10.3 ppg.

HHC CHAMPS

The Dragons won a piece of their third Hoosier Heritage Conference championship this season, and first since 2019, when the Dragons won it outright. They also won the league title in the HHC's inaugural season of 1993-94. The lone blemish on the conference docket was an overtime loss in December, but the Dragons then ripped off five consecutive wins over conference foes to clinch the title, claiming it with a 47-35 victory over Yorktown Jan. 25. In that contest, the Dragons jumped out to an 18-6 lead after a guarter and built it to 33-12 early in the third. With a title on the line, the two senior starters delivered. Allie Blum had 16 points, eight boards, five assists and three steals. Vivian Miller added 12 points and six rebounds.

SECTIONAL HISTORY

The Dragons are 39-42 all-time in sectional games and 40-48 all-time in tournament games. In the class era (post-1998), they are 22-21 in sectional games and 23-25 in tourney games.

The Dragons have won sectional titles in 1990, 1992, 1993 - all at Mt. Vernon - 2004 (3A) at Pendleton Heights, 2018 (4A) at Connersville and 2020 (4A) at Richmond. Allen Cooper coached the first four titlists, while Sarah Gizzi who played for the 1992 and 1993 championship teams - led the 2018 and 2020 champs.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Senior **Allie Blum** tallied her second career double-double Jan. 18 against Waldron, tallying 23 points and tying her career high with 12 rebounds. Blum's last double-double was when she had 14 points and 11 boards Dec. 20, 2022 against Lawrence Central.

BARRAGE, THEN LOCKDOWN

The Dragons used a 3-point barrage to rally from a 14-point deficit in the 43-37 victory over Triton Central Jan. 9. The Dragons trailed 18-4 when **Kenna Tweedy** came off the bench and drilled a 3-pointer from the top of the key. The Dragons' next 24 points would come from beyond the arc. NP went on to hit 8-of-12 from deep the rest of the half, finishing the half with 17 consecutive points. **Sadey Hughbanks** hit a career-high four 3-pointers and scored 14 of her game-high 16 points in the second quarter. **Kendra Moore** hit two 3-pointers and **Allie Blum** one in the quarter. Blum had a career-high seven assists in the contest.

Then, in the second half, the Dragons went into lockdown mode. After allowing the tying basket with 6:10 to go, the Dragons did not allow a point the remainder of the game, holding TC to 0-9 from the floor in that stretch. **Kylee Beranek**'s rebounding was key - she had a career-high nine boards, several down the stretch.

RECORD SETTER

Senior **Allie Blum** tied the Dragons' record for points in a regulation game Nov. 16 at Warren Central. Blum scored 36 points in the contest, hitting 10-21 from the floor and 12-15 from the line. She was 4-9 from the 3-point line. She became the first Dragon to score 30 points in a game since Isabella Gizzi tallied 34 Dec. 30, 2022 against Roncalli.

STRONG AT SOUTHPORT

The Dragons had a tremendous second half on both ends Dec. 21 in their 60-22 victory at Southport. The Dragons outscored the Cardinals 36-6 after halftime - setting season-bests in both categories - including a 26-5 third guarter. The 26 points scored in the third guarter tied a season-best, while the one point allowed in the fourth guarter also tied a season-best for points allowed in a quarter. The Dragons forced 24 turnovers and had 16 offensive boards. Senior guard Allie Blum scored 28 points, including 11-23 from the floor. As a team, the Dragons were 22-53 and had 25 more field goal attempts than Southport, thanks in part to 16 offensive boards. Sadey Hughbanks had nine rebounds and Blum eight.

The 38-point win margin was the largest since a 68-24 victory over New Castle Nov. 29, 2022. The 22 points allowed were the fewest since a 68-17 victory over Connersville Nov. 7, 2019.

AT THE RIGHT TIME

The Dragons got big contributions from sophomore Kenna Tweedy at key moments in their 52-47 victory over Franklin County Dec. 28. They trailed 32-22 in the third quarter, but began clawing back, tying the game early in the fourth on Sadey Hughbanks' 3-pointer out of the corner. After FC scored four straight, Tweedy hit a jumper to tie the game again. With the Dragons trailing, Tweedy drilled a 3-pointer at the top of the key to give the Dragons their first lead of the night at 48-46 in the final two minutes. She capped the game with two free throws for her second double-figure game of the year. Allie Blum scored 19 and Vivian Miller 15 in that contest. The Dragons outscored the Wildcats 30-15 in the final 12 minutes of the game.

RALLY IN 40

The Dragons trailed New Castle 40-34 with 40 seconds remaining Nov. 28, but rallied to win in regulation. In the final minute, Kenna Tweedy put back her own miss to cut the deficit to four. On the next New Castle possession, the Trojans missed a layup but regained possession on a tie-up on the rebound. However, Allie Blum stole the inbounds pass and was fouled. She hit both free throws to cut the deficit to two. In the final 10 seconds, Blum forced a steal and fed the ball to Kendra Moore, who hit Vivian Miller for a lavup to tie the game. New Castle inbounded with five seconds left, but Blum again stole the ball in the backcourt, again feeding Moore, who hit Miller for the game-winning layup ahead of the buzzer. Blum had nine steals in the contest to lead the Dragons.

MILLER HITS 25

Senior guard **Vivian Miller** is often setting other people up as the Dragons' point guard, but she was the primary scorer Jan. 12 against Pendleton Heights. Miller scored seven early points, added seven more in the second quarter and finished with a career-high 25 points. In the third, she hit an early 3-pointer to help the Dragons build a 35-18 lead, then scored two three-point plays to stave off a PH run, tallying nine points in the frame. Her previous career high was 21 points, set Nov. 25 at Whiteland.

She missed first four games of the season due to a soccer injury, but returned and made a quick impact. She had eight rebounds and five assists in her first game, Nov. 15 against Franklin Central.

CLEANING THE GLASS

The Dragons had a season-high 48 rebounds Jan. 18 against Waldron, including 25 offensive boards. Allie Blum tallied her first double-double of the season and the second of her career with 23 points and 12 rebounds. Kylee Beranek and Kendra Moore each had seven rebounds. Vivian Miller had 12 points and five boards. Ella Holman and Natalie Sevier tallied five boards each,

RIVALRY WIN

The Dragons defeated arch-rival Mt. Vernon for the first time since the 2020 sectional with a 41-33 victory Dec. 12.
