SETTING THE SCENE

- The Dragons play for a sectional title for the sixth time in seven years as they meet rival Greenfield-Central. The Dragons are seeking their second straight sectional championship, their fourth in six years and their 11th overall. They have won six sectional championships since 2007.
- NP leads the all-time series with G-C 30-29. The Dragons have won six of the last nine meetings.
- This is the Dragons' 107th appearance in the IHSAA tournament, dating back to 1916-17. NP has won 10 sectional titles in its history, six of which have come since 2009. Head coach Trent Whitaker has led NP to three championships.
- In Class 4A (2012-15, 2018-present), the Dragons are 19-6 in sectional games and have won four sectional championships.
- The Dragons finished in the IBCA the Top 20 for the second straight year. The Dragons finished No. 14 in 2023.

DRAGONS NOTES

- The Dragons have had the flair for the dramatic, as **Ben Slagley** scored the winning points with four seconds left in Tuesday's sectional opener against Mt. Vernon, then hit a buzzer-beater Friday in the victory over Pendleton Heights.
- Friday night, Slagley took a feed from Moses Haynes and laid it in for the winner. It
 was Slagley's third time this season scoring the winning basket in the closing seconds he also hit a buzzer-beater against Guerin Catholic.
- The Dragons hit 10 3-pointers Friday against PH, their second-highest total of the season. They hit 11 Feb. 10 against Connersville.
- Haynes led the Dragons with 18 points, hitting four of the 10 3-pointers. He is 14-21 from deep the last three games. Brady Armstrong hit three 3-pointers and tied his career high with nine points. Julius Gizzi, the state's second-leading scorer, added 11. Slagley scored 10 to give the Dragons three double-figure scorers.
- The Dragons outlasted Mt. Vernon 58-56 Tuesday in a tremendously-played game
 that saw the Dragons take the lead twice in the final 20 seconds. Julius Gizzi's
 three-point play with 17 seconds left put NP up 56-54. After MV tied it on a long
 jumper, Slagley drew a foul and hit two free throws with four seconds left, then stole
 a pass at the buzzer to seal the victory.
- With 21 wins, the Dragons have tied the second-highest win total in school history.
 NP also won 21 games in 1989 (21-3). The school record is 23-3, set last year.
- The Dragons shot 55.6% (19-34) against MV.
- Gizzi, the state's leading second-leading scorer at 29.8 ppg, now has 748 points this season, extending his school record. He has 987 career points, moving past Matthew True into 11th place on the all-time list. He needs 13 points to both reach 1,000 points and move into the NPHS Top 10. He has tallied 20-plus points in 23 games this season and 30-plus points in 13 of the Dragons' 26 contests.
- Haynes has 171 assists this season, a school record. He is currently sixth on the NPHS career assists list with 245. He ranks fourth in the state at 7.1 apg.
- Gizzi (8.4) and Slagley (7.2) are first and second in the HHC in rebounding. Haynes is also fifth in the HHC in steals (2.1).

SCOUTING THE COUGARS

G-C is the state's lone unbeaten team. The Cougars are led by junior Braylon Mullins, who averages 26.1 ppg, and junior Boston Willard (11.3 ppg). Dallas Freeman scored 17 points and Mullins 16 in G-C's 54-44 victory over Muncie Central Friday. The Cougars are playing in their first sectional final since 2003.

Junior Ben Slagley's buzzer-beater Feb. 6 gave the Dragons a 63-61 victory at then 3A No. 5 Guerin Catholic. Slagley rebounded Julius Gizzi's miss and scored just ahead of the horn to deliver the victory. He scored 16 points on 8-9 shooting in the contest, and tallied six of the Dragons' seven fourth-quarter points. Earlier, he scored on a feed from Moses Haynes to tie the game at 61-61 to set up the winning shot.

Slagley would become Mr. Clutch twice in the sectional. In the opener, he hit two free throws with four seconds left to give the Dragons a 58-56 victory over Mt. Vernon. He then hit a shot at the buzzer three nights later in a 60-58 victory over Pendleton Heights.

Junior Julius Gizzi has put together the biggest scoring season in NPHS history to date. He scored at least 20 points in each of the Dragons' first 18 games and has scored 30 or more points 14 times this season.

That run began Dec. 15-16. On Friday at New Castle, Gizzi scored 21 first-half points and finished with 31 on 14-of-23 shooting from the floor. He also had eight rebounds. The next night, however, was one of the greatest scoring performances in school history. He tallied 43 points in the 75-56 victory over Franklin Central, hitting 13-of-22 from the floor and 15-of-17 from the free throw line. The 43 points were the thirdmost in school history, the sixth 40-point game in program history, and three points shy of Ryan Curry's school record set in 2015.

Gizzi eclipsed that Feb. 17 against Whiteland, when he scored 44 points on 19-of-36 shooting and added a career-high 16 rebounds. The 44 points set a gymnasium record for most points scored in a game, and also tied for the second-highest scoring performance in school history. The 78 points scored against Whiteland and Connersville are a school record for points in consecutive games.

Gizzi's first 30-point game was the first since Blaine Nunnally tallied 31 against Yorktown Jan. 29, 2021. The 40-point game was the first since his brother Maximus Gizzi scored 41 against Whiteland Feb. 22, 2020. He became the first Dragon to score 30 points in two consecutive games since Michael Morris scored 31 against Shelbyville and 32 against Mooresville Feb. 1-2, 2013.

DROPPING DIMES

Junior Moses Haynes became the school's single-season assists leader during the Feb. 10 game against Connersville, when he dished nine assists to break Jeff Mitchell's 31-year-old record of 138. Four nights earlier, Haynes set a single-game school record with 14 assists in the Dragons' 63-61 victory at Guerin Catholic.

Havnes has hit double-digit assists four times. doing so the first time when he had 13 Jan. 5 against Delta. It was the first double-digit assists game for a Dragon since Duke Blackwell had 10 Jan. 31, 2016 against Perry Meridian. Prior to that, the most recent 10-assist game was when Moses' older brother Solomon Haynes dished 11 assists Dec. 16, 2010 against Morristown.

Haynes also had 10 assists against Perry Meridian and Shelbyville this season. He is in sixth place in career assists.

LONG RANGE

Junior guard Moses Haynes has made a career of setting up others for baskets, but he's also one of the Dragons' top long-range shooters. Haynes showed why in the regular season finale Feb. 23 at Greenwood, when he hit 7-8 from distance - and 8-9 from the floor overall - to score a career-high 24 points in the Dragons' 70-52 victory. Haynes followed with a 3-4 performance from deep in the sectional opener against Mt. Vernon and 4-7 against Pendleton Heights. He is 14-21 in his last three games.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Junior Julius Gizzi was named the IBCA Player of the Week for his performance Dec. 29-30 at the Ray Furney Classic. He scored 119 points over four games - a 29.8 average tallying 30 against Jennings County, 35 against Newport (Ky.), 24 against Bethesda Christian and 30 agaiinst Pike Central. That included a 20-point third quarter against Jennings County. Gizzi was 44-83 from the field (53%), 15-29 from deep (52%) and 16-20 from the free throw line (80%). He also averaged 6.8 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game in the tournament.

PUSHING NO. 1

The Dragons traveled to No. 1 Lawrence North Jan. 24 and pushed the state's top-ranked team to the wire. NP led for most of the game including 26-21 at the half and 43-38 early in the fourth quarter. NP had a chance to tie the game in the final minute before falling 57-48. Julius Gizzi scored 36 points.

STEPPING UP

Junior Austin McMahan had two career games the last weekend of January. Against No. 1 Lawrence North, McMahan grabbed 10 rebounds for the Dragons, doubling his previous career high. Two nights later at Yorktown, he scored 14 points on 7-10 shooting, setting a career high. McMahan also had 10 points against Southport, scoring six in the fourth quarter as the Dragons put the game away.

NO LONGER PERFECT

The Dragons knocked Richmond from the ranks of the unbeaten with a 63-57 victory over the Red Devils Jan. 16 at the Tiernan Center. The victory snapped a 16-game winning streak for the Red Devils. NP trailed by five early, but Moses Haynes' 3-pointer gave NP a 30-27 halftime edge and Julius Gizzi's basket at the end of the third put NP up for good. Gizzi tallied 33 points and nine boards. Haynes had 13 points and seven assists in the victory.

BLOCK PARTY

Ben Slagley entered the season fifth on the NPHS blocked shots list and has moved up to third. Against Franklin Central, he became the fifth player to register 40 blocks in a career. He tallied 50 blocks by tying his career high with four Dec. 30 against Bethesda Christian, moving into fourth place on the career blocked shots list. He also had four blocks against New Castle and Southport. He passed Seth Cox for third place Jan. 24 at Lawrence North.

RECORD-SETTER

Head coach Trent Whitaker became the winningest coach in NPHS history with the 77-60 victory over Roncalli Jan. 19. He is one of three Dragons coaches to win 120 games, joining Kehrt and Adam Barton, two coaches with whom he served as an assistant. BLISTERING SHOOTING

The Dragons had a hot-shooting performance Dec. 29 against Jennings County. They hit 35-of-56 from the floor for a 62.5% shooting percentage. Julius Gizzi was 12-17 for 30 points, Ben Slagley 6-7 for 12 points and Moses Haynes 6-8 for 16 points. The Dragons hit 10-of-19 from 3-point range, with Gizzi hitting 4-of-6 and Haynes 4-of-5. It marked Gizzi's third straight 30-point game and a career-high for Haynes. Slagley added 10 rebounds and nine assists.

The next day, the Dragons shot 56.9% (37-65) in a 91-48 victory over Pike Central. It was the Dragons' largest victory margin of the year and their highest point total since December 2021. Gizzi hit 11-20 - including 5-7 from deep - to score 30. Slagley hit 7-7 to score 16.

The Dragons were even better Jan. 19 against Roncalli. They hit 30-45 from the floor - a 66.7% shooting percentage - in a 77-60 victory. Gizzi was 13-18 and Haynes 7-10 in that contest.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE MAN

Junior Ben Slagley had four double-doubles in the 2022-23 season, then followed it up with a 19-point, 11-rebound performance in the Dec. 1 season opener. He had a 12-point, 10-rebound performance Dec. 29 against Jennings County. He was one assist shy of a triple-double in that game, as he had nine assists. The next day, he tallied 16 points and 11 boards against Pike Central.

GIZZI IN DOUBLES

Junior Julius Gizzi has six double-doubles this season. He had 24 points and 10 boards in the Dec. 1 season opener at Eastern Hancock, and then tallied 25 points and 13 rebounds Jan. 20 against Franklin. He added 34 points and 12 boards Feb. 10 against Connersville. He followed Feb. 17 with 44 points and 16 boards, both career highs, against Whiteland. A third straight double-double came with 27 points and 13 boards Feb. 20 at Mt. Vernon, and that was followed with 17 points and 13 rebounds Feb. 23 at Greenwood. He became the first Dragon to record double-doubles in consecutive games since Ben Slagley did so three straight games in the 2022-23 season.

BASKETBALL FAMILY

Juniors Moses Haynes and Julius Gizzi are cousins, but their roots run deep in basketball - especially at NPHS. Each is the third of their siblings to play basketball for the Dragons - Moses' older brothers Samson and Solomon Haynes were guards for the Dragons in the early 2010s. Gizzi's older brother Maximus is the Dragons' boys basketball career scoring leader, with 1,612 points from 2016-20. His older sister Isabella is the girls career scoring leader, with 1,676 points from 2019-23. Their mother, Sarah (Haynes) Gizzi, is second on the NPHS girls basketball scoring list and was the girls basketball varsity coach from 2017-23, winning 98 games, two sectional titles and an HHC title. Moses Haynes' father, Noah Haynes, was the head coach at Brebeuf Jesuit from 2012-14 and led the state in scoring in 1989 as a player at Frontier. Their grandfather, Bruce Haynes, was the Dragons' boys varsity coach from 1990-94, an assistant girls basketball coach from 2017-23.

RANKED WIN

Junior Ben Slagley's putback at the buzzer sealed a ranked road victory over the Dragons Feb. 6 at Guerin Catholic. The Dragons won 63-61 over 3A's No. 5 team. Slagley had 16 points on 8-9 shooting from the floor. He added eight boards. Moses Havnes had 17 points and a school record 14 assists. Julius Gizzi added 17 points. The Dragons have two other wins against teams ranked at the time of the game -Jan. 5 against Delta (then 3A No. 2) and Jan. 16 at Richmond.

THE NEXT LEVEL

The Dragons have three alumni playing college basketball. From the Class of 2023, Ian Stephens is a walk-on at Indiana. Two other members of the Class of 2023 are playing other sports - Blaine Nunnally is playing baseball at Southwest Tennessee Community College and Eian Roudebush was the HCAC Freshman of the Year as a quarterback at Hanover. From the Class of 2022, Steele Brasfield is playing for Indiana Tech, while 2020 graduate Maximus Gizzi is at Marian.

MOSES THE THIEF

Junior Moses Haynes has been the Dragons' top pilferer on the defensive end this season, but he tallied a career high with eight steals Dec. 30 against Bethesda Christian.

POSTSEASON HONORS

2023 grads Ian Stephens and Blaine Nunnally each received All-Hoosier Heritage Conference honors this season. For Nunnally, it was his third All-Conference selection and Stephens' second.

HOT HAYNES

Junior Moses Haynes had a big week in the first three-game week of the year. He scored 13 points against Richmond, then added a career-high 19 against Roncalli, hitting 7-10 from the floor and 5-7 from deep. That career high lasted 24 hours. The next night, he hit 6-10 from deep and scored 21 points against Franklin. Paired with Julius Gizzi's 25, they became the first duo to score 20 in a game since Blaine Nunnally and Ian Stephens did so in 2023, also against Franklin.

The duo repeated the feat Feb. 10 against Connersville, when Gizzi scored 34 and Haynes 21.

LATE WIN

The Dragons found themselves in a back-and-forth game with New Castle that featured 10 second-half lead changes, including four on the final four possessions, before the Dragons pulled out a 61-60 victory. The Dragons trailed 55-50 in the fourth, but a putback by Austin McMahan touched off a 6-0 run that gave NP a 56-55 lead. McMahan's steal led to a Ben Slagley putback, followed by a steal by Evan Darrah and a 50-foot pass for a Moses Haynes layup to give NP the lead. New Castle answered with a driving shot, but the Dragons answered with a fallaway jumper by Julius Gizzi in the lane to re-take the lead at 58-57. But New Castle answered with a 3-pointer with 30 seconds left. However, the Dragons had the exclamation point. A beautiful passing play off a timeout led to Haynes and Gizzi feeding Slagley rolling to the basket. Slagley hit the shot, drew a foul and calmly drained the free throw to get a victory. The defense forced a turnover and a rushed, contested shot in the final 16 seconds to seal the victory.

DOMINATING AT HOME

The Dragons' Feb. 10 86-39 victory over Connersville was NP's first-ever home win over the Spartans in six tries. It was the 11th-largest margin of victory in school history. Julius Gizzi had 34 points and 13 boards, while Moses Haynes had 21 points and nine assists.

HISTORIC YEAR

The Dragons have posted their 11th season of at least 18 victories. This year marks the first time NP has won 17+ games three years in a row in school history. The Dragons have won 61 games over the last three years, the best three-year stretch in school history. This year's 19 wins are tied for third-most in school history.
