SETTING THE SCENE

- The Dragons close the 2023 portion of their schedule with a Thursday matinee against Franklin County. The Dragons are looking to head into 2024 with a .500 record against a strong FC team.
- This is the first all-time meeting between the two schools. The Dragons are 1-2 against Eastern Indiana Athletic Conference teams this season. They will play five EIAC teams this year.
- Franklin County is one of two new opponents to the Dragons' schedule this season.
 The Dragons will also play Bloomington North for the first time in their history next Thursday.
- The teams have two common opponents so far. The Dragons are 2-0 (beat Shelbyville 56-49, beat Batesville 59-39); while the Wildcats are 1-1 (lost to Shelbyville 50-46, beat Batesville 43-41).

DRAGONS NOTES

- The Dragons enter the week after a 60-22 victory over Southport, their biggest victory margin since a 68-24 victory over New Castle Nov. 29, 2022, and their fewest points allowed since a 68-17 victory over Connersville Nov. 7, 2019. The Dragons allowed only nine field goals in the game and outscored the Cardinals 36-6 in the second half, setting season-bests for a half in both categories. The 26 points scored in the third quarter tied a season-best, while the one point allowed in the fourth also tied a season-best.
- Senior **Allie Blum** scored 28 points the second-highest total of her career against Southport. She hit 11-23 from the floor and 6-9 from the line. Earlier in the season, she scored a career-high 36 tying a school record for points in a regulation game against Warren Central. Blum has scored in double figures in 14 of the Dragons' 15 games this season and tallies 18.1 ppg.
- Junior Kylee Beranek added nine points against Southport.
- The Dragons had 16 offensive boards against Southport. Sophomore Sadey Hughbanks grabbed nine total rebounds, while Blum had eight.
- Senior **Vivian Miller** returned to the lineup aginst Southport after a two-game absence and tallied three assists. She leads the HHC in assists with 4.2 per game. Blum is seventh (2.3 apg).
- The Dragons have won three of their last four games on their home court.
- At 18.1 ppg, Blum is currently third in the Hoosier Heritage Conference in scoring.
 Miller ranks 10th in the conference at 11.3 ppg. Blum also ranks third in steals (3.8 spg), with Miller eighth (2.6 spg).

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS

- Franklin County enters this contest on a four-game winning streak, the most recent an 80-55 victory over Waldron Dec. 22. Senior Nicole Mears leads the Wildcats, scoring 18.1 ppg and grabbing 7.6 rpg. Sophomore Ruby Singer adds 10.5 ppg and 9.0 rpg.
- The Wildcats are building off a 16-7 season, their most wins since 2017. They are seeking their first back-to-back winning seasons since 2015-17.

LOOKING AHEAD

 The Dragons hit the road next Thursday to play Bloomington North before a fourgame January homestand, which begins Jan. 9 against Triton Central and is followed with the annual doubleheader with Pendleton Heights Jan. 12.

Two Dragons seniors are committed to play collegiately in softball. **Allie Blum** is committed to the University of Kentucky, while **Ella Holman** is committed to the University of Dayton.

RECORD SETTER

Senior **Allie Blum** tied the Dragons' record for points in a regulation game Nov. 16 at Warren Central. Blum scored 36 points in the contest, hitting 10-21 from the floor and 12-15 from the line. She was 4-9 from the 3-point line. She became the first Dragon to score 30 points in a game since Isabella Gizzi tallied 34 Dec. 30, 2022 against Roncalli.

STRONG AT SOUTHPORT

The Dragons had a tremendous second half on both ends Dec. 21 in their 60-22 victory at Southport. The Dragons outscored the Cardinals 36-6 after halftime - setting season-bests in both categories - including a 26-5 third guarter. The 26 points scored in the third guarter tied a season-best, while the one point allowed in the fourth quarter also tied a season-best for points allowed in a guarter. The Dragons forced 24 turnovers and had 16 offensive boards. Senior guard Allie Blum scored 28 points, including 11-23 from the floor. As a team, the Dragons were 22-53 and had 25 more field goal attempts than Southport, thanks in part to 16 offensive boards. Sadey Hughbanks had nine rebounds and Blum eight.

The 38-point win margin was the largest since a 68-24 victory over New Castle Nov. 29, 2022. The 22 points allowed were the fewest since a 68-17 victory over Connersville Nov. 7, 2019.

COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

The Dragons trailed New Castle 40-34 with 40 seconds remaining, but rallied to win in regulation. In the final minute, Kenna Tweedy put back her own miss to cut the deficit to four. On the next New Castle possession, the Trojans missed a layup but regained possession on a tie-up on the rebound. However, Allie Blum stole the inbounds pass and was fouled. She hit both free throws to cut the deficit to two. In the final 10 seconds, Blum forced a steal and fed the ball to Kendra Moore, who hit Vivian Miller for a layup to tie the game. New Castle inbounded with five seconds left, but Blum again stole the ball in the backcourt, again feeding Moore, who hit Miller for the game-winning layup ahead of the buzzer. Blum had nine steals in the contest to lead the Dragons.

WELCOME BACK

Senior **Vivian Miller** missed the first four games of the season due to a soccer injury, but returned and made a quick impact. She had eight rebounds and five assists in that game. Miller then scored her career high with 21 points and added six assists in the Nov. 25 loss to Whiteland.

SHARP SHOOTING

The Dragons shot a season-best 50% - 22-of-44 from the field - in the Dec. 5 victory over Shelbyville. The victory showed the Dragons' balance, as **Sadey Hughbanks** scored a career-high 17 points on 7-of-10 shooting. **Vivian Miller** and **Kylee Beranek** scored 10 each, with Beranek hitting 4-of-5 from the floor. **Kendra Moore** shot 3-of-5 and scored eight points. Miller also had a career-high eight assists in the contest.

DOMINATING THE GLASS

In the Dragons' 57-47 victory over Delta Dec. 2, both **Sadey Hughbanks** and **Natalie Ssevier** had double-digit rebounding games. Hughbanks had 11 boards and Sevier 10. Hughbanks also had 11 rebounds Nov. 21 against Delta.

The high rebounder for the season is **Kenna Tweedy**, who had 12 boards in the Nov. 8 win at Greenwood.

RIVALRY WIN

The Dragons defeated arch-rival Mt. Vernon for the first time since the 2020 sectional with a 41-33 victory Dec. 12. The Dragons had strong balance in the victory, with **Allie Blum** scoring 10 points and both **Vivian Miller** and **Sadey Hughbanks** scoring nine each. The Dragons hit 33% from deep, including 3-6 from Hughbanks. They were also a perfect 9-of-9 from the line.

MEET COACH MOORE

Craig Moore was named the 15th head coach in program history in April 2023. He had spent the previous season as the Dragons' junior varsity coach. Moore brings 16 years of coaching experience to the position. He has coached at New Palestine Junior High, as well as coaching junior high girls and boys at Morristown from 2012-21. Prior to that, he was an assistant coach to Scott McClelland at Morristown from 20007-10, and spent two seasons coaching junior high boys in Rushville under coach Kerry Brown.

Moore is a graduate of Rushville High School and the University of Indianapolis. He also holds a graduate degree from Indiana State University. Moore is an assistant principal at NPHS.

Assistant coach Erin Amones is a longtime teacher in the Southern Hancock district who currently teaches special education at NPHS. JV coach Leah Seib was a standout player for New Palestine from 2015-19 and led the Dragons to a sectional title in 2018 and an HHC title in 2019. She played collegiately at Marian University.
