SETTING THE SCENE

- The Dragons return to conference play with a home game against Pendleton Heights. The Dragons are looking to win their fourth straight contest.
- This is the 40th meeting between the two programs. NP trails the series 20-19, but has won seven consecutive meetings since 2018. The Dragons swept two meetings last year, winning 48-35 in the sectional behind Julius Gizzi's team-high 13 points. Gizzi had 15 in a 58-41 regular-season victory.
- The Dragons are receiving votes in the IBCA single-class poll for the second straight week and the fourth poll week this season.

DRAGONS NOTES

- The Dragons enter this contest on a three-game winning streak, including last Friday's 62-54 victory over then-3A No. 2 Delta, their first win over a ranked team this season
- The Dragons shot 60% last Friday against Delta, hitting 25-42. Austin McMahan was a perfect 5-of-5 for a career-high 10 points. Julius Gizzi was 11-18 for 34 points and Ben Slagley 8-13 for 16 points. It was their second-best shooting performance of the year - they hit 62.5% against Jennings County.
- As a team, the Dragons are shooting 54% from the floor and 38% from deep. McMahan (68%) and Slagley (64%) are the top field goal shooters, while Gizzi (45%) leads the Dragons from beyond the arc.
- Junior **Moses Haynes** is one of the state's top point guards, and showed why Friday. as he dished 13 assists in the Dragons' victory over Delta. He became the first Dragon to have double-digit assists since Duke Blackwell had 10 against Perry Meridian Jan. 31, 2016. Prior to that, the previous 10-assist game was produced by Moses' older brother Solomon Haynes, when he had 11 Dec. 16, 2010 against Morristown.
- Gizzi's 34 points against Delta marked his second straight 30-point game and his sixth 30-point game in his last seven contests. The 34-point performance was the third-highest of his season and career. He had 43 against Franklin Central and 35 against Newport (Ky.). Gizzi just missed a double-double, as he had nine rebounds, one shy of his career high.
- Gizzi and Slagley both reached 500 career points against Delta. Gizzi now has 530 points. Slaglev 511. Gizzi has scored 291 points this season.
- Slagley now has 51 career blocked shots, fourth-most in school history. He needs three blocks to tie Seth Cox for third place.
- Gizzi is third in the state in scoring at 29.1 ppg, trailing International's Philip Randolph (31.6) and Maconaguah's Josiah Ball (30.1).
- Slagley (7.5) and Gizzi (7.5) are tied for the HHC lead in rebounding. Haynes (6.6) leads the conference in assists, with Slagley (3.9) fourth. Havnes also ranks sixth in the state in assists. Haynes is fourth in steals (2.1).

SCOUTING THE ARABIANS

- Pendleton Heights finished fourth in last week's Madison County Tournament, falling 53-50 to Anderson in the first round, then beating Elwood 63-26 and Anderson Prep 75-38 in the consolation bracket.
- Senior Josiah Gustin (13.3 ppg, 6.3 rpg) leads the Arabians. Junior Evan Mozingo adds 10.6 ppg, while sophomore Caden Sims and senior Sam LaRavia each score 7.2 ppg.
- Joe Buck has returned the head coaching position after a 17-year absence, much of which was spent as Pendleton Heights' superintendent. He led the Arabians to six sectional titles from 1993-2006 in his first stint as head coach.

The Dragons play a three-game week next week, with a Jan. 16 trip to No. 11 Richmond followed by weekend games against Roncalli and No. 20 Franklin at home, their lone January double-weekend.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Junior Julius Gizzi was named the IBCA Player of the Week for his performance Dec. 29-30 at the Ray Furney Classic. He scored 119 points over four games - a 29.8 average - tallying 30 against Jennings County, 35 against Newport (Ky.), 24 against Bethesda Christian and 30 agaiinst Pike Central. That included a 20-point third quarter against Jennings County. Gizzi was 44-83 from the field (53%), 15-29 from deep (52%) and 16-20 from the free throw line (80%). He also averaged 6.8 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game in the tournament.

30 ... 30 ... 40

Junior Julius Gizzi had one of the best weekends in school history Dec. 15-16. On Friday at New Castle, Gizzi scored 21 first-half points and finished with 31 on 14-of-23 shooting from the floor. He also had eight rebounds. The next night, however, was one of the greatest scoring performances in school history. He tallied 43 points in the 75-56 victory over Franklin Central, hitting 13-of-22 from the floor and 15-of-17 from the free throw line.

The 43 points were the third-most in school history, the sixth 40-point game in program history, and three points shy of Ryan Curry's school record set in 2015.

The 74 points scored in the weekend is a school record for points in consecutive games.

His 30-point game was the first since Blaine Nunnally tallied 31 against Yorktown Jan. 29, 2021. The 40-point game was the first since his brother Maximus Gizzi scored 41 against Whiteland Feb. 22, 2020. He became the first Dragon to score 30 points in two consecutive games since Michael Morris scored 31 against Shelbyville and 32 against Mooresville Feb. 1-2, 2013.

Gizzi also became the first Dragon to score 20 points in five consecutive games since Steele Brasfield did so from Feb. 5-18, 2022.

DROPPING DIMES

Junior Moses Haynes scored two points against Delta, but factored in on 26 more, as he had 13 assists in that contest. It was the first double-digit assists game for a Dragon since Duke Blackwell had 10 Jan. 31, 2016 against Perry Meridian. Prior to that, the most recent 10-assist game was when Moses' older brother Solomon Haynes dished 11 assists Dec. 16, 2010 against Morristown.

BLISTERING SHOOTING

The Dragons had a hot-shooting performance Dec. 29 against Jennings County. They hit 35-of-56 from the floor for a 62.5% shooting percentage. Julius Gizzi was 12-17 for 30 points, Ben Slagley 6-7 for 12 points and Moses Haynes 6-8 for 16 points. The Dragons hit 10-of-19 from 3-point range, with Gizzi hitting 4-of-6 and Haynes 4-of-5.

It marked Gizzi's third straight 30-point game and a career-high for Haynes. Slagley added 10 rebounds and nine assists, narrowly missing a triple-double.

The next day, the Dragons shot 56.9% (37-65) in a 91-48 victory over Pike Central. It was the Dragons' largest victory margin of the year and their highest point total since December 2021. Gizzi hit 11-20 - including 5-7 from deep - to score 30. Slagley hit 7-7 to score 16.

MOSES THE THIEF

Junior Moses Haynes has been the Dragons' top pilferer on the defensive end this season, but he tallied a career high with eight steals Dec. 30 against Bethesda Christian.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE MAN

Junior Ben Slagley had four double-doubles in the 2022-23 season, then followed it up with a 19-point, 11-rebound performance in the Dec. 1 season opener. He had a 12-point, 10-rebound performance Dec. 29 against Jennings County. He was one assist shy of a triple-double in that game, as he had nine assists. The next day, he tallied 16 points and 11 boards against Pike Central.

WIN AT THE HORN

The Dragons found themselves in a back-and-forth game with New Castle that featured 10 second-half lead changes, including four on the final four possessions, before the Dragons pulled out a 61-60 victory. The Dragons trailed 55-50 in the fourth, but a putback by Austin McMahan touched off a 6-0 run that gave NP a 56-55 lead. McMahan's steal led to a Ben Slagley putback, followed by a steal by Evan Darrah and a 50-foot pass for a Moses Haynes layup to give NP the lead. New Castle answered with a driving shot, but the Dragons answered with a fallaway jumper by Julius Gizzi in the lane to re-take the lead at 58-57. But New Castle answered with a 3-pointer with 30 seconds left. However, the Dragons had the exclamation point. A beautiful passing play off a timeout led to Haynes and Gizzi feeding Slagley rolling to the basket. Slagley hit the shot, drew a foul and calmly drained the free throw to get a victory. The defense forced a turnover and a rushed, contested shot in the final 16 seconds to seal the victory.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE x2

In the season opener against Eastern Hancock, the Dragons recorded a double double-double. Ben Slagley tallied 19 points and 11 rebounds, while Julius Gizzi reached career highs with 24 points and 10 boards. It was the Dragons' first double double-double since Slagley and Ian Stephens did so Jan. 6, 2023 against Delta. It was Slagley's fifth career double-double and Gizzi's first.

CHASING THE RECORD

Head coach Trent Whitaker became the fifth coach in NPHS history to win 100 games with the victory over Metropolitan Dec. 28, 2022, then moved into fourth place on the career wins list the next day. He moved into third place on the all-time wins list in the Dec. 1 opener against Eastern Hancock and second place Dec. 29 against Jennings County. He is three wins away from tying Brian Kehrt's record as the Dragons' all-time winningest coach.
