SETTING THE SCENE

- The Dragons play their penultimate home game of the season as they face the Waldron Mohawks. This is Waldron's first-ever visit to NPHS in girls basketball.
- The teams have met once, a 70-39 victory for the Dragons last season. Allie Blum had 15 points in that contest.
- The Dragons have won four straight games on their home court and four of their last five games overall.
- Two more victories would clinch the Dragons' ninth consecutive winning season, setting a program record. The Dragons had eight straight winning seasons from 1991-99.

DRAGONS NOTES

- The Dragons posted one of their biggest victories in their recent history Friday, beating Pendleton Heights 52-48. The Dragons built a 17-point lead in the third quarter and played solid defense down the stretch to seal the victory. The win puts them in position to clinch a piece of the Hoosier Heritage Conference title, which they can do with a victory Jan. 25 at Yorktown.
- Senior Vivian Miller set a career high with 25 points Friday against Pendleton Heights. Miller hit 9-of-16 from the floor and 5-of-6 from the line. In the third quarter, she scored nine points - hitting an early 3-pointer to help the Dragons build a 17-point lead. She then scored two critical three-point plays to stave off PH runs.
- Senior Allie Blum tallied 12 points against PH, including three late free throws that helped seal the game. Her third-quarter 3-pointer gave the Dragons their biggest lead of the game at 35-18. Blum also had five rebounds - four offensive - and four steals.
- Sophomore Kenna Tweedy tied her career high with six rebounds including four
 on the offensive glass. She scored five points coming off the bench, all on putbacks.
 Kendra Moore also tied her career high with five boards. The Dragons had 10 offensive boards and a 39% offensive rebounding percentage against the taller Arabians.
- The victory marked two straight wins over teams with winning records. On Tuesday, the Dragons rallied from a 14-point deficit Tuesday to beat Triton Central 43-37, using a three-point barrage in the second quarter. The Dragons scored 24 consecutive points from behind the 3-point arc, hitting a season-high eight triples for the game. **Sadey Hughbanks** hit four 3-pointers and scored 16 points in the contest, tallying 14 in the second quarter. The 16-point effort was one shy of her career high of 17, set Dec. 5 against Shelbyville. Tweedy started the outside shooting run with a 3-pointer to end the first quarter. Moore hit two and Blum one. NP hit 8-of-12 from deep in that stretch and finished the first half with a 17-0 run.
- Blum dished a career-high seven assists Tuesday against TC.
- Miller ranks second in the HHC in assists, dishing 3.5 per game. Blum is fifith at 2.6 assists per contest.
- Blum ranks third in the HHC in scoring at 17.8 ppg. Miller is 11th at 10.3 ppg.
- Blum also ranks third in the conference in steals at 3.8 per contest. Miller is tied for eighth (2.5 spg).

SCOUTING THE MOHAWKS

- Waldron enters the week having dropped five straight games, all by double digits.
 Their most recent defeat was a 71-30 loss Saturday at Eastern Hancock.
- Freshman Grace Fischer leads Waldron, averaging 15.4 ppg. Senior Alyssa Benson adds 12.2 ppg.

LOOKING AHEAD

Next week, the Dragons play their final week of the regular season with Senior Night against Greensburg on Tuesday, followed by a Thursday trip to Yorktown in which the Dragons can clinch a piece of the HHC title.

BARRAGE, THEN LOCKDOWN

The Dragons used a 3-point barrage to rally from a 14-point deficit in the 43-37 victory over Triton Central Jan. 9. The Dragons trailed 18-4 when **Kenna Tweedy** came off the bench and drilled a 3-pointer from the top of the key. The Dragons' next 24 points would come from beyond the arc. NP went on to hit 8-of-12 from deep the rest of the half, finishing the half with 17 consecutive points. **Sadey Hughbanks** hit a career-high four 3-pointers and scored 14 of her game-high 16 points in the second quarter. **Kendra Moore** hit two 3-pointers and **Allie Blum** one in the quarter. Blum had a career-high seven assists in the contest.

Then, in the second half, the Dragons went into lockdown mode. After allowing the tying basket with 6:10 to go, the Dragons did not allow a point the remainder of the game, holding TC to 0-9 from the floor in that stretch. **Kylee Beranek**'s rebounding was key - she had a career-high nine boards, several down the stretch.

COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

The Dragons trailed New Castle 40-34 with 40 seconds remaining Nov. 28, but rallied to win in regulation. In the final minute, Kenna Tweedy put back her own miss to cut the deficit to four. On the next New Castle possession, the Trojans missed a layup but regained possession on a tie-up on the rebound. However, Allie Blum stole the inbounds pass and was fouled. She hit both free throws to cut the deficit to two. In the final 10 seconds. Blum forced a steal and fed the ball to Kendra Moore, who hit Vivian Miller for a layup to tie the game. New Castle inbounded with five seconds left, but Blum again stole the ball in the backcourt, again feeding Moore, who hit Miller for the game-winning layup ahead of the buzzer. Blum had nine steals in the contest to lead the Dragons.

STRONG AT SOUTHPORT

The Dragons had a tremendous second half on both ends Dec. 21 in their 60-22 victory at Southport. The Dragons outscored the Cardinals 36-6 after halftime - setting season-bests in both categories - including a 26-5 third quarter. The 26 points scored in the third guarter tied a season-best, while the one point allowed in the fourth quarter also tied a season-best for points allowed in a quarter. The Dragons forced 24 turnovers and had 16 offensive boards. Senior guard Allie Blum scored 28 points, including 11-23 from the floor. As a team, the Dragons were 22-53 and had 25 more field goal attempts than Southport, thanks in part to 16 offensive boards. Sadey Hughbanks had nine rebounds and Blum eight.

The 38-point win margin was the largest since a 68-24 victory over New Castle Nov. 29, 2022. The 22 points allowed were the fewest since a 68-17 victory over Connersville Nov. 7, 2019.

AT THE RIGHT TIME

The Dragons got big contributions from sophomore Kenna Tweedy at key moments in their 52-47 victory over Franklin County Dec. 28. They trailed 32-22 in the third quarter, but began clawing back, tying the game early in the fourth on Sadey Hughbanks' 3-pointer out of the corner. After FC scored four straight, Tweedy hit a jumper to tie the game again. With the Dragons trailing, Tweedy drilled a 3-pointer at the top of the key to give the Dragons their first lead of the night at 48-46 in the final two minutes. She capped the game with two free throws for her second double-figure game of the year. Allie Blum scored 19 and Vivian Miller 15 in that contest. The Dragons outscored the Wildcats 30-15 in the final 12 minutes of the game.

SHARP SHOOTING

The Dragons shot a season-best 50% - 22-of-44 from the field - in the Dec. 5 victory over Shelbyville. The victory showed the Dragons' balance, as **Sadey Hughbanks** scored a career-high 17 points on 7-of-10 shooting. **Vivian Miller** and **Kylee Beranek** scored 10 each, with Beranek hitting 4-of-5 from the floor. **Kendra Moore** shot 3-of-5 and scored eight points. Miller also had a career-high eight assists in the contest.

DOMINATING THE GLASS

In the Dragons' 57-47 victory over Delta Dec. 2, both **Sadey Hughbanks** and **Natalie Ssevier** had double-digit rebounding games. Hughbanks had 11 boards and Sevier 10. Hughbanks also had 11 rebounds Nov. 21 against Delta.

The high rebounder for the season is **Kenna Tweedy**, who had 12 boards in the Nov. 8 win at Greenwood.

RIVALRY WIN

The Dragons defeated arch-rival Mt. Vernon for the first time since the 2020 sectional with a 41-33 victory Dec. 12. The Dragons had strong balance in the victory, with **Allie Blum** scoring 10 points and both **Vivian Miller** and **Sadey Hughbanks** scoring nine each. The Dragons hit 33% from deep, including 3-6 from Hughbanks. They were also a perfect 9-of-9 from the line.

MILLER HITS 25

Senior guard **Vivian Miller** is often setting other people up as the Dragons' point guard, but she was the primary scorer Jan. 12 against Pendleton Heights. Miller scored seven early points, added seven more in the second quarter and finished with a career-high 25 points. In the third, she hit an early 3-pointer to help the Dragons build a 35-18 lead, then scored two three-point plays to stave off a PH run, tallying nine points in the frame. Her previous career high was 21 points, set Nov. 25 at Whiteland.

She missed first four games of the season due to a soccer injury, but returned and made a quick impact. She had eight rebounds and five assists in her first game, Nov. 15 against Franklin Central.

MEET COACH MOORE

Craig Moore was named the 15th head coach in program history in April 2023. He had spent the previous season as the Dragons' junior varsity coach. Moore brings 16 years of coaching experience to the position. He has coached at New Palestine Junior High, as well as coaching junior high girls and boys at Morristown from 2012-21. Prior to that, he was an assistant coach to Scott McClelland at Morristown from 20007-10, and spent two seasons coaching junior high boys in Rushville under coach Kerry Brown.

Moore is a graduate of Rushville High School and the University of Indianapolis. He also holds a graduate degree from Indiana State University. Moore is an assistant principal at NPHS. He and wife Misty have two children. Their son Drake currently plays basketball at Oakland City University. Their daughter Kendra is a sophomore at NPHS and a member of the varsity basketball team.

Assistant coach Erin Amones is a longtime teacher in the Southern Hancock district who currently teaches special education at NPHS. JV coach Leah Seib was a standout player for New Palestine from 2015-19 and led the Dragons to a sectional title in 2018 and an HHC title in 2019. She played collegiately at Marian University.
