PREGAME NOTES

SETTING THE SCENE

- The Dragons hit the road for the fifth time in six weeks with a visit to New Castle for the final road game of the regular season.
- This is the 10th meeting between the Dragons and Trojans since 2014. The Dragons have won the previous nine by an average score of 54-8. Last year, the Dragons won 42-7, with **Blaine Nunnally** tallying a career-high 94 receiving yards.
- The Dragons are in possession of the HHC's Helmet trophy. They held it from 2013-20 and regained possession after a 42-6 victory at Mt. Vernon in Week 4.
- The Dragons can clinch a piece of their 22nd conference title - and 12th HHC title - with a victory this week.

DRAGONS NOTES

- Senior QB **Danny Tippit** threw for 239 yards and four touchdowns in last week's 56-0 victory at Shelbyville. He completed his first 13 pass attempts and finished 14-of-17. Over the last four weeks, he has completed 75 percent of his passes (63-of-84) for 984 yards and 16 touchdowns, including tying a school record with five TDs against Greenfield-Central. Over the season, he has 1,496 yards and is completing 72 percent of his throws. He needs four yards for the 12th 1,500-yard passing season in NPHS history.
- Junior RB **Grayson Thomas** became the first Dragon to post three 1,000-yard rushing seasons last week, with a 138-yard, three-TD effort giving him 1,024 yards for the season. He also has 3,413 yards and 49 touchdowns for his career. He moved into third place on the NPHS career rushing list and rushing TDs list last week. He needs 550 yards and three TDs to catch Jeff Miles for second place on each list.
- Senior **Blaine Nunnally** has been on the receiving end of several of Tippit's TDs. He has 11 catches the last three weeks, six for touchdowns, including both of his receptions against Shelbyville. He is the Dragons' second-leading receiver with 341 yards. Seven of his 22 catches have gone for TDs.
- Junior **Kyler Kropp** led a balanced receiving effort with five catches and 70 yards last week, as well as a TD.
- Senior **Isaiah Thacker** tallied four catches for 66 yards. Thacker moved into sixth place on the NPHS career receiving list with 1,187 yards. He needs 53 yards to catch Brandon Collins and move into sixth place. He needs 83 yards to move into fifth place, passing Jay Ehle. He also needs 21 yards for 1,500 for his career, factoring in yardage gained when he played for Triton Central as a sophomore.
- Senior LB **A.J. Reiersen** led the Red Rage with 10 tackles last week. It was the seventh double-digit tackle performance for the Dragons this season.
- The Dragons are plus-13 in turnover ratio, with 17 takeaways and four giveaways. **Daniel Thacker** has three interceptions and a fumble recovery to lead the team.
- Junior OL **Ian Moore** is the No. 1-rated offensive tackle nationally by Rivals, who has Moore rated as the No. 1 Class of 2024 prospect in the state and No. 33 in the nation.

SCOUTING THE TROJANS

- New Castle defeated Delta two weeks ago before falling to Mt. Vernon last week. Quarterback Quentin Boatright threw for 141 yards and a TD last week against MV. He accounted for 218 yards of total offense the week before. He has thrown for 446 yards. Jon Eberhart has run for 447 yards and Boatright 332 to lead New Castle's offense.
- New Castle is scoring 15 ppg and allowing 24 ppg.

- The Dragons return home to close the regular season next week against Delta.
- The IHSAA sectional draw will be held at 5 p.m. Sunday. The Dragons play in Class 4A Sectional 22.

THE NEXT LEVEL

Two Dragons have already made verbal commitments to play college football. Senior OL/DL **Luke Burgess** has committed to Louisville after receiving 28 offers. Burgess is the No. 7-rated recruit in Indiana in the Class of 2023 and the 41st-ranked offensive tackle nationally by 247. Rivals has him ranked sixth in Indiana and 37th nationally among OTs. Senior WR/DB **Isaiah Thacker** has committed to Ball State, where he will join 2020 graduate Kyle King. Thacker is rated the No. 39 prospect in Indiana and 320th nationally among wide receivers by 247.

TRIPLE-THREAT THACKER

Senior WR/DB **Isaiah Thacker** is a triple-threat for the Dragons. He is a two-time All-State defensive back, but also was the team's leading receiver last season with 34 catches, 693 yards and five touchdowns. Thacker also averaged 27.8 yards per kickoff return, with a 65-yard touchdown return in the sectional-opening win over Franklin. He eclipsed the 1,000-yard receiving mark for his career against Westfield. Thacker had a career-high 147 yards against Pendleton Heights, a game in which he broke the 1,000-yard mark for his NPHS career.

NUNNALLY A 3-SPORT STAR

Senior WR **Blaine Nunnally** has become a three-sport standout for the Dragons. He'll be a four-year starter in basketball this upcoming season, where he has averaged 11.4 ppg for his career. He led the HHC in basketball assists last season with 4.4 per game. He is also a standout baseball player who hit .260 for the Dragons' sectional championship team this past spring and had a 2.80 ERA. On the gridiron, he has been a two-way standout at WR and DB for three years.

HOOKING THE COUGARS

Senior LB **Eli Hook** tallied a monster game in the Dragons' 42-7 victory over Greenfield-Central. Hook had a career-high 18 tackles, one for loss and blocked two punts. Hook has now blocked three punts this season.

In addition, **Blaine Nunnally** had 15 tackles and **Michael Thacker** had 13 tackles, two tackles for loss and two forced fumbles in the victory.

Hook has three double-digit tackle games - he tallied 11 each against Westfield and Mt. Vernon.

TIPPIT TOSSING

Senior QB **Danny Tippit** has had a solid start to his tenure as a Dragon. Against Pendleton Heights, he was on point, going 18-of-21 for a career-high 310 yards and four touchdowns. It was the first 300-yard passing game since Lincoln Roth threw for 341 yards against Franklin in 2020. It was the first four-TD game since Roth against PH in 2019. He completed passes to six different receivers. **Isaiah Thacker** had six catches for a career-high 147 yards.

Tippit has four consecutive 200-yard games, as he completed 11-of-20 for 220 yards against Mt. Vernon the week prior to the PH game, and then was 20-of-26 for 215 yards against Greenfield-Central. He was 14-of-17 for 239 yards and four TDs against Shelbyville.

STATE LEADERS

Senior QB **Danny Tippit** ranks ninth in the state and first in Class 4A with 1,496 passing yards.

Junior RB **Grayson Thomas** ranks 20th in the state and sixth in Class 4A with 1,024 rushing yards. Thomas is also 19th in the state and third in 4A with 96 punts.

Senior WR **Isaiah Thacker** is ninth in Class 4A and 46th in the state with 494 receiving yards.

Senior K **Brendan Tanksley** is tied for fourth in the state and leads Class 4A with 46 kicking points.

All lead the HHC in their respective categories.

Sophomore DT **Michael Thacker** is tied for second in the HHC with 6 sacks. He is tied for 23rd statewide and seventh in 4A.

As a team, the Dragons lead Class 4A and are 11th in the state with 46.1 ppg. Defensively, the Dragons are 19th in the state and tied for fourth in 4A, allowing 9.7 ppg. The Dragons' 36.4 scoring margin leads Class 4A and is eighth statewide.

He holds nine Big Ten offers from Indiana, Iowa, Michigan State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Ohio State, Penn State, Purdue and Wisconsin. He also has offers from SEC programs Missouri and Tennessee and multiple ACC (Boston College, Duke, Florida State, Louisville, Miami, North Carolina) and Big 12 (Cincinnati, Iowa State, West Virginia) teams.

Moore is a four-star recruit, the No. 1-ranked prospect in Indiana, the No. 4 offensive tackle and the 91st overall prospect in the Class of 2024 nationally by 247. Rivals has Moore ranked as the No. 1 offensive tackle nationally and the No. 33 overall prospect - No. 1 in Indiana.

EARLY OFFERS

Sophomore DL **Michael Thacker** has two Div. I FBS offers so far in his career - from Ball State and Tennessee. Thacker has six sacks.

21 IN A MINUTE

The Dragons tallied a blitz of points to start their victory over Shelbyville, scoring 21 points in 57 seconds of playing time. It began with a 15-yard TD run by **Grayson Thomas** with 7:14 left in the first quarter. After a successful on-side kick, the Dragons drove 50 yards in two plays, with **Blaine Nunnally** catching a 9-yard pass from **Danny Tippit** with 6:32 left. After **Michael Thacker** recovered a fumble on Shelbyville's first play, Tippit and Nunnally hooked up again from 19 yards out with 6:17 left in the period.

Thomas scored another TD in the quarter for a 28-point period - their highest-scoring quarter of the season.

The two TDs 15 seconds apart were the fastest two scores since Charlie Spegal and Eric Roudebush scored nine seconds apart Aug. 23, 2019 against Kokomo.

TYING A MARK

Senior QB **Danny Tippit** tied a school record in the 42-7 victory over Greenfield-Central, throwing five touchdown passes. He completed a career-high 20 passes for 215 yards. He threw TDs to **Blaine Nunnally** (2), **Ty Mitchell**, **Kyler Kropp** and **Cameron Rollyson**.

It was the first game with five TD passes since Alex Neligh - the Dragons' current QB coach - threw for five in the 77-42 victory over New Prairie in the 2014 state title game. It was the first game with four players catching TD passes Oct. 9, 2015, when Duke Blackwell, Logan Greene, Brett Luker and James Crumlin caught TD passes against New Castle.

POSTSEASON HONORS

The Dragons had several players honored by the Hoosier Heritage Conference after the 2021 season. On offense, lineman **Ian Moore**, running back **Grayson Thomas** and now-graduated quarterback Damon Hockett were named to the team. It was Thomas' second such selection.

Defensively, linebacker **Eli Hook** and defensive back **Blaine Nunnally** were honored by the conference, as well as now-graduated linebacker Gus Walling. **Brendan Tanksley** was the all-conference kicker.

Isaiah Thacker was named 5A IFCA Junior All-State - his second such selection - and now-graduated Madix Johnson was named Senior All-State. Johnson is running track at Trine University.

PICK-SIX

The Dragons had pick-6s in back-to-back weeks. Senior LB **Eian Roudebush** intercepted a pass and took it to the house in the third quarter of the 49-0 victory over Decatur Central Aug. 26. It was the Dragons' first defensive score since **Blaine Nunnally** had a 35-yard interception return against Yorktown Sept. 3, 2021. The next week, **A.J. Reierson** intercepted a pass and ran it back 13 yards for a score at Yorktown. It marked the third consecutive season the Dragons have had a pick-6 against Yorktown - Aidan Ewers and Hunter Burks both did so in 2020 and Nunnally had one in 2021.

THE LONG MARCH

While the Dragons have been known for quick strikes during coach **Kyle Ralph's** tenure, they used long marches against Westfield. The first drive of the season was a 16-play, 80-yard jaunt that ended in **Grayson Thomas's** 28-yard TD run and chewed 5:32 off the clock. Later in the game, after the Shamrocks had cut a Dragon lead to 28-14 in the third, the Dragons went on a 15-play, 80-yard drive - with all but one play on the ground - that ended in a 1-yard TD run by Thomas. That drive took 8:02 off the clock and helped the Dragons put away a 42-14 victory. The Dragons had 28:11 of possession time in the game.

BLOCK PARTY

Senior LB **Eli Hook** blocked a punt against Yorktown, the Dragons' first blocked punt since **Michael Thacker** against New Castle in 2021. Hook later blocked two punts against Greenfield-Central. **Blaine Nunnally** blocked one against Shelbyville.

FLIP THE SCOREBOARD

The Dragons struck quickly and often in the third quarter Sept. 2 at Yorktown, scoring four touchdowns in 4:39 of clock time, including three in less than three minutes.

It started when **Grayson Thomas** capped a 91-yard TD drive with a 1-yard run to put the Dragons up 24-10 with 5:16 left in the quarter. Fifty-two seconds later, **A.J. Reierson** intercepted a pass and took it back 13 yards for a score. After another interception by **Daniel Thacker**, QB **Danny Tippit** capped a two-play, 45-yard drive with an 18-yard pass to **Eli Hook** with 2:18 left in the quarter. **Blaine Nunnally** picked off a pass and the Dragons needed three plays to go 25 yards and score on Tippit's 8-yard run with 37 seconds left. The Dragons added another score with 8:43 to go in the fourth, a 3-yard run by Thomas, to give them 33 points in 8:33. Their last three offensive scoring drives took a total of seven offensive snaps.

BIG QUARTERS

The Dragons have been no strangers to explosive quarter this season. They scored 21 in the second quarter against Decatur Central, 26 in the third quarter against Yorktown and 20 in the opening frame against Mt. Vernon. They followed with 21 in the second quarters against Pendleton Heights and Greenfield-Central.

ZERO HEROES

The Red Rage's 49-0 shutout of Decatur Central was the 23rd of coach **Kyle Ralph's** career and the first since blanking Shelbyville 52-0 Oct. 1, 2021. The Dragons have posted at least one shutout in each of the last 10 seasons. They held Decatur Central to 62 rushing and 205 total yards in the contest and forced three turnovers.

It was the first time Decatur Central had been shut out since 2006.

BIG STRIKES VS. HAWKS

The Dragons used big plays to propel a 49-0 victory over Decatur Central Aug. 26. On the game's fourth snap, **Grayson Thomas** carried for a 51-yard TD. Thomas also had touchdowns of 44 and 24 yards, while **Eli Hook** had a 51-yard TD reception. The Dragons had 439 yards of total offense and 18 first downs on just 36 snaps - an average of 12.2 yards per play. Three of the six touchdown drives took less than five plays and 90 seconds. The defense got in on the big play action, too, as **Eian Roudebush** had a 44-yard pick-6.

MEET COACH RALPH

Head coach **Kyle Ralph** is in his 10th season at New Palestine and has led the program to new heights. In his time at NPHS, the Dragons have won three state titles, four semistate championships, five regional titles and six sectional titles. The Dragons have also won seven Hoosier Heritage Conference titles under his tutelage. He was the fastest coach in Indiana history to 100 wins, needing just 109 games to reach that milestone.

Ralph brought immediate success to New Palestine, with an attacking, aggressive mindset on and off the field, a commitment to the weight room and a philosophy of building a program with character and class. It led to immediate success, as the Dragons won 65 consecutive regular-season games to start his tenure - the second-longest streak in state history - and won their first regional title in 23 years in his first year. A state title followed in 2014, and a year in which the Dragons set state records for total offense (7,701 yards) and scoring offense (854 points) followed in 2015. Ralph has coached multiple All-State performers and two Mr. Football position award winners. Ralph enters 2021 with a 104-10 career record.

He is a 2002 graduate of St. Xavier High School in Cincinnati and a 2006 graduate of the University of North Carolina, where he was a two-time First-Team All-ACC performer at offensive tackle. He was the ACC's Coastal Division Lineman of the Year in 2005. Ralph has participated in NFL training camps with the Carolina Panthers and Seattle Seahawks. Prior to coming to NPHS, he coached at St. Xavier, Oak Hills and Withrow University High Schools in Cincinnati. He also assists with the Dragons' track and field team, coaching the throwers.

Ralph lives in New Palestine with his wife Ashley, a NPHS graduate, and their three children. He teaches physical education at NPHS.

RETURNING HOME

The Dragons' coaching staff features three players who played for Coach **Kyle Ralph**. **Duke Blackwell** was a standout receiver who graduated in 2016. **Nick Brickens** is also a 2016 graduate. Both played collegiately at St. Francis, where they were national champions. **Alex Neligh** quarterbacked the 2014 state championship team and 2015 state runner-up squad and graduated in 2016.

DRAGONS IN COLLEGE

Nineteen former Dragons are currently playing college football, including five at the NCAA Div. I level - Maxen Hook (Tolledo), Kyle King (Ball State), Charlie Spegal (Indiana), David DeGuzman (Maryland) and Matthew Brown (Indiana State). Also playing collegiately are Ethan Sturgeon, Tucker Keevers and Austin Keele (Indianapolis), Damon Hockett, Jacob Hockett and Aven Jones (Taylor), Aidan Ewers (St. Francis), Nick Bastian, Richard Clevenger and Will Olive (Wabash), Caleb Byers (Anderson), Gus Walling (Mount Union), as well as Brody Luker and Eric Roudebush (Hanover).

RETURNING TO 4A

The Dragons are a Class 4A school by enrollment, but played the last seven seasons in Class 5A due to the IHSAA's Tournament Success Factor.

The Dragons had much success in 5A, winning state titles in 2018 and 2019 and advancing to the State Finals in 2015. The Dragons also won a 5A sectional in 2021.

RECORD ENROLLMENT

NPHS has a record enrollment of 1,202 students, bolstered by a 324-student freshman class, the largest class in school history. The enrollment gain is 35 students from last year. That has translated to the largest football participation in school history, with more than 60 players on the varsity/JV roster and more than 90 total.

NO SIBLING RIVALRY

The Dragons have two sets of twins on the roster - seniors **Blaine** and **Bryant Nunnally** and freshmen **Caden** and **Connor Jacobia** are also twins. In addition, seniors **Isaiah** and **Daniel Thacker** and sophomore **Michael Thacker** are also siblings. Freshmen **John** and **Garrett Ranes** and sophomore **Josh Ranes** are also siblings.

TWO-SPORT KICKERS

Senior kicker **Brendan Tanksley** is busy in the fall, as he plays for both the Dragons football and HHC co-champion soccer teams. He is 106-111 on PATs and 13-20 on field goals in his career.

Against Yorktown, Tanksley drilled a 47-yard field goal at the end of the first half. It was a school record and marked his second 40-plus-yard boot. He also connected from 40 in the 2021 sectional against Franklin. He was an All-HHC selection as a kicker last season.

Sophomore **Jake Wells** also plays both football and soccer, where he is a goalkeeper. Wells booted his first career field goal - a 25-yarder - against Shelbyville in 2021, and later connected on a 40-yarder against Delta. He is the team's punter.
